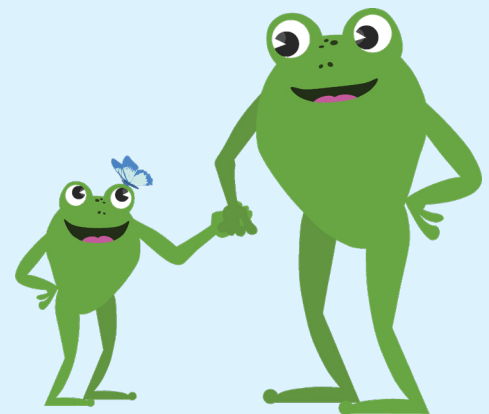

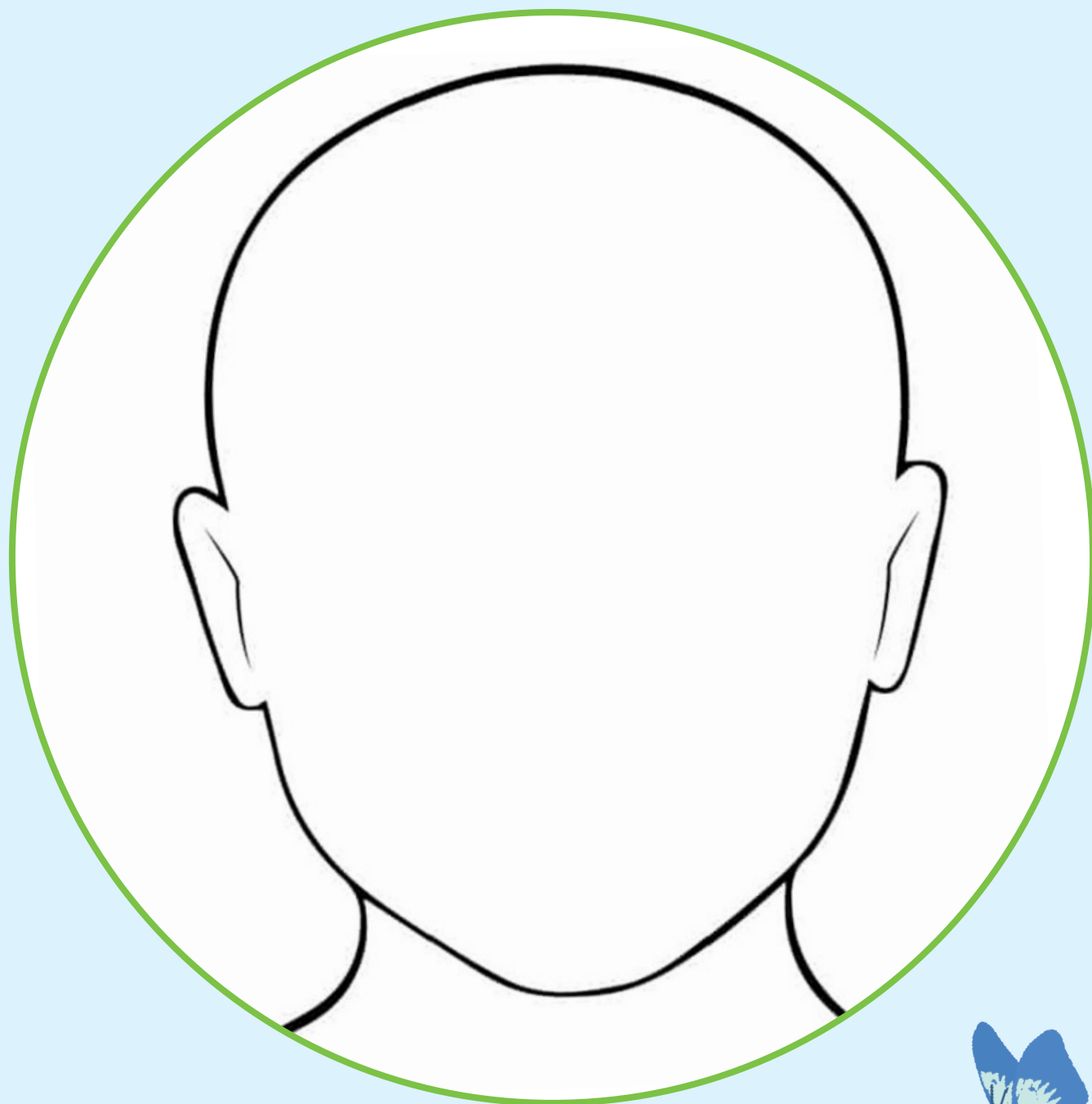

TIP: If your child isn't sure what the describing word means try showing them an example, "I notice you found a rock that is very smooth." To check for understanding you could then ask, "Can you find something else that is smooth?" By describing what's happening while it's happening, you are connecting words with actions or meanings.
